
and Computers was the course instructor.

Experiencing History with five senses

The department of History of L. S. Raheja College of Arts and Commerce had organised an exhibition on 28th January 2020 in the college auditorium. Artifacts like fossils, stone tools, pottery, musical instruments, weapons, coins, sculptures were on display. Furthermore, there was a practical demonstration of Warli painting, writing in ancient scripts, pottery painting with Indus Valley civilization motifs and musical instruments which were introduced and used frequently during the medieval period. The Students were allowed to see and touch certain artifacts.



In order to cater to the taste, 'Phirni' was served, which originated during the medieval period. There was a special theme 'Mughal Janankhana', displaying some artifacts used during that period. Ittar, a.k.a the Smell of Muhammad (Perfume) was also on the display to cater to the sense of smell along with its history and interesting facts.



The course covered the theory as well as practical both. Students also appeared for an online test conducted by the course instructor and their performances were satisfying.

Know - The Finance Bill On February 5th 2020, C.A. Mr Hrishikesh Wandrekar delivered a very relevant lecture on 'The Finance Bill 2020' in college AV room. He gave a detailed explanation on the impact of the bill at various levels in the society. From individual level to different sectors

Bloom's Taxonomy

On 11th February Ms. Sabiha More Associate Professor of Surajba College of Education delivered a lecture on 'Bloom's Taxonomy' to the staff of the Degree college. Bloom's taxonomy is an heuristic designed to help educators develop teaching methods that will move student's learning beyond rote memorisation. Learning beyond memorising is sometimes considered higher order or deeper learning.

She explained how Bloom's Taxonomy is a good heuristic for teachers to understand the varying levels of cognitive, psychomotor, and effective demand that teachers have as outcomes for students. It also helps with assessments in terms of matching your assessment items to the level of your objectives that teachers have as outcome for students.

She gave a detailed explanation on how Bloom's Taxonomy helps teachers to understand the design and assessment of learning tasks. This helped teachers create outcomes & accomplish goals of the academic programmes.

BFM-Stockers' Association's FINZARD


Workshop on Action Research
