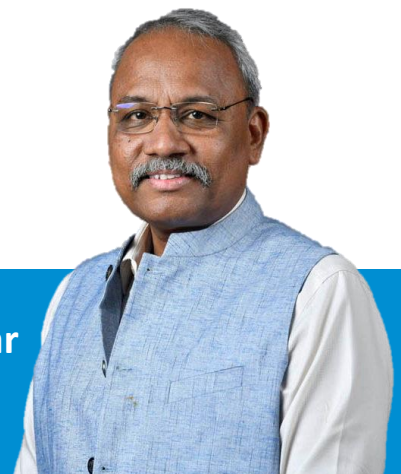

## ADMISSION

### CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION

- i. The students must fill admission forms as per the schedule announced by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education. The List of students granted admission will be displayed on the notice board and web site as per the admission schedule.
- ii. Admission to the students given in any class, will be on the basis of the rules and regulations prescribed by the College / Government of Maharashtra.
- iii. An admission granted to any student in the college, in any class, shall be valid for that particular academic year.
- iv. All admissions are purely provisional and subject to confirmation by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune.
- v. There will be no automatic admission to the Second year. It will, however, be dependent on the following factors:
  - a) Discipline in the Class / College.
  - b) Regularity in Attendance.
  - c) Satisfactory Academic Performance.
  - d) Respect shown towards all members of teaching and non-teaching staff.
- vi. The tuition and other fees prescribed below will have to be paid by the students on the day as per the notification displayed on the notice board.
- vii. Change of subject, if any, will be permitted as per rules & regulations.
- viii. No admission can be claimed as a matter of right and the Principal's decision in this regard is final and binding.

### NORMS FOR APPLYING UNDER GUJARATI LINGUISTIC MINORITY

- i. He/she should be Gujarati by birth and should have passed the S.S.C / equivalent examination from the state of Maharashtra only.
- ii. In case if the student is not GUJARATI by birth but the mother of the applicant is Gujarati, the marriage certificate of the parent indicating mother's name must be produced for verification.
- iii. In case of doubtful surnames, the parent will have to produce their 10th std. mark sheet indicating Gujarati as one of the subjects in 10<sup>th</sup> Std.
- iv. He / She should have a Certificate from the Head of the Community / Trust / institution (Government recognized) confirming the claim of belonging to Gujarati Linguistic Minority Community.



## ADMISSION

### ADMISSION PROCESS

- i. An Online Admission Process is conducted by the Deputy Director of Education and the students are admitted as per the list sent by the Deputy Director of Education, Greater Mumbai. Students Seeking Admission to F.Y.J.C. under the Open, Sports, Cultural Categories and Other Reservations should apply through the online process.
- ii. Applicants who are allotted the Junior College should fill the application form available in the College website [www.lsracheja.org](http://www.lsracheja.org)
- iii. Admission to the F.Y.J.C. under the Gujarati Linguistic Minority Category (50%), In-House Category (MALTI JAYANT DALAL HIGH SCHOOL) (10%) and Management Quota (5%) will be done by the College as per the schedule declared by the Deputy Director of Education. Admission is strictly as per merit list prepared by the College Administration.
- iv. For admission through Inhouse, Minority or Management quota students should register in the online registration portal <https://11thadmission.org.in/>
- v. Students Seeking Admission to F.Y.J.C. under Inhouse, Minority or management quota are also required to apply the prescribed form available on the College website [www.lsracheja.org](http://www.lsracheja.org)
- vi. Students should refer to the Notice Board for detailed instructions about the admission procedure from time to time.
- vii. Students, who have passed I.C.S.E. or C.B.S.E. or any Public Examinations of the Statutory Board, Recognized bodies outside the Maharashtra State, will have to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility issued by the Secretary, Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.
- viii. No Student can be admitted to the College without a valid Leaving Certificate from the School last attended by him/her. A non-satisfactory remark in Leaving Certificate renders the student ineligible for admission. Students who have passed I.C.S.E. or C.B.S.E. or any other examination from a Board other than the State of Maharashtra must have their Leaving Certificate countersigned by the Education Inspector.
- ix. All entries in the Admission form must be filled in correctly. In case of wrong information, admission is liable to be cancelled and fees forfeited.
- x. Girl students whose parents are residents of Maharashtra for not less than 15 years and who are not the fourth or subsequent child are eligible for educational concession.
- xi. For optional subjects (Mathematics, Information Technology) admission is strictly based on the percentage of marks secured at 10<sup>th</sup> Std. level.

Students who are selected on merit are eligible to get I.T. and pay the I.T. fee.

Full Year Fees has to be paid at the time of admission.

Admission will not be effective without the payment of fees and will be treated as cancelled unless the fees are paid on the day admission is granted.

If it is established by documentary evidence at any stage of study that the student has presented bogus documents the admission shall be liable for cancellation and fees paid will not be refunded.



## CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION

- i. For the cancellation of admission, a candidate has to apply in the prescribed form duly signed by him/her and counter signed by his/her parent/guardian.
- ii. The candidate has to enclose the original fee receipt along with the form.
- iii. The refund of fees is as per the rules framed by the Deputy Director of Education from time to time.

## UNDERTAKING

All candidates who have applied for admission shall be deemed to have submitted the following undertaking:-

“I have read all the rules of admission and after understanding these rules thoroughly, I have filled the application form for admission for the current year. The information given by me in my application is true to the best of my knowledge and belief. I understand that if any of the statements made by me in the application form or any information given by me in connection with my admission, if found to be false or incorrect, my admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and I may be expelled from the college by the principal.

- I have not been debarred from appearing at any examination by any government constituted or statutory examination authority in India.
- I understand that no documents after the last date of submission will be accepted for the purpose of claims or concessions etc.. in connection with my admission unless otherwise mentioned in the rules.

## ATTENDANCE

- i. It is absolutely imperative for all students to attend all the lectures / practicals / tutorials punctually and regularly.
- ii. To be eligible to appear for the examination, either at College level or Board level, it will be obligatory for students to attend a minimum of 75% of the lectures, practicals and tutorials.
- iii. Attendance for the day is granted if and only if the student has attended all the lectures / practicals / tutorials conducted during the day.
- iv. For the purpose of calculation of attendance, the college office records will be taken as final and binding on the students.
- v. In respect of the attendance of students Regulation 88 made by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education is applicable.

### ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARING EXAMINATION

For the students to be eligible to appear at college examination, it is necessary to have a minimum attendance of 75% in lectures and tutorials and to keep terms as per rules. Students will be required to produce their bonafide Identity Cards.

### VERIFICATION OF MARKS

There shall be no revaluation of answer books at FYJC examinations. However, the facility of verification of marks shall be available. Students must submit their application for verification along with photocopy of mark sheet and necessary fees as prescribed, within the stipulated time. The verification shall be done by the Examination Committee.



## RULES FOR PROMOTION - FYJC

*(As per circular from Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune) Circular No. Exam – 2016 /Sr.No.189/S.D-2 Dated 28/10/2016)*

- i. A candidate must secure minimum 35 marks out of 100 in each of the subjects.
- ii. Submit the projects/assignment/journal within the schedule announced by the college.
- iii. If a candidate appearing in all subjects fails in one or more subjects, his deficiency of marks in maximum 3 subjects to a maximum of 15 marks but not exceeding 10 marks in any one subject shall be condoned for the purpose of passing the examination.
- iv. Condonation will be given such that the concession shall not exceed the required minimum percentage of passing in the subject i.e. 35%
- v. There is no provision of Allowed To Keep Terms (ATKT).
- vi. No candidate will be promoted to the next class if he/she fails even after applying the rule of giving the benefit of condonation of marks as provided in the rule No.03 of condonation.
- vii. There will be no re-examination in the case of students who fail.
- viii. In case of students who fail to appear at the First or Second Term end Examination for genuine reasons, such as ill health (on production of medical certificate in time) or such other reason beyond his/her control (such as natural calamities), the Head of the Junior College shall hold the First Term end examination as early as possible, but in any case before the end of the second term. However, the Second Term re-examination in case of such students shall be conducted immediately after the second term end examination.

## PROCEDURE FOR INVESTIGATION IN CASE OF UNFAIR MEANS

- i. The College has an Unfair Means Inquiry Committee, which conducts an enquiry into alleged copying cases during examinations. The candidate who has allegedly resorted to unfair means shall be served a show cause notice and made aware of the charges/allegations reported against him/her so that he/she can prepare his/her defense at the time of his/ her appearance before the Unfair Means Inquiry Committee. The committee shall inform him/her of the proposed action to be taken in his/her case with a request to reply to the show cause notice as to why the action proposed under it should not be taken against him/her. The reply received by the committee from the candidate in this regard, shall be considered by the committee and the final recommendation in the matter shall be made to the Principal. The Principal shall exercise his/her authority and issue the final order.
- ii. **Use or Possession of Mobile phones or any other electronic devices during examination is strictly prohibited and it will be considered as an Unfair Means Case.**

## COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS

- i. The College attaches great importance to discipline which must be scrupulously observed by all students. Failure to comply with any of the rules and regulations from time to time will lead to strict disciplinary action.
- ii. Students must always keep with them the Identity Card issued by the College with their recent photograph affixed, bearing the signature of the Principal and they must present it for inspection or verification whenever demanded by the college Authorities and / or by the Security Staff. No student shall be allowed to attend lectures, practicals etc.. unless he/she wears Identity Card around the neck.
- iii. Students must not attend lectures other than their own without the special permission of the Principal.
- iv. Students should make use of the College library if they have a free lecture.
- v. Students must be in their respective classrooms in time. Late comers may not be allowed to enter the classroom.
- vi. Students must do nothing either inside or outside the College that will in anyway interfere with its orderly administration and discipline. They should not communicate any information or write anything about the College to the Press or post any information on any website / You Tube / Face Book etc.. without prior written permission of the Principal.
- vii. Students are liable to lose their terms for disobedience, misconduct, misbehavior, indiscipline.
- viii. Students must take proper care of College property. Any damage done to the property of the College by way of disfiguring walls, doors, windows and fittings or breaking furniture etc.. will be treated as breach of discipline and the students concerned will be punished, fined and/or suspended. Smoking, Tobacco-Chewing, Consumption of Drugs etc.. are strictly prohibited in the College premises.
- ix. Use of Mobile phones, Walkman, etc.. in the College Premises is strictly (restricted to specific places) prohibited.
- x. No student shall collect money as contribution for picnic, trip, educational visit, get-together, study notes, charity or for any other activity without prior written permission of the Principal.
- xi. All bonafide students are accountable to the Principal. Their behaviour inside and outside the College should not be detrimental to the image of the College and any individual or group of students should refrain from all such activities which may bring disrepute to the College, and such students if found guilty may be expelled or suspended from the College.
- xii. Ragging is prohibited within or outside the College. If any complaint is received the person concerned will be prosecuted under Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999.
- xiii. Photography or Videography of the campus and classrooms, laboratories, office, etc.. is strictly prohibited.
- xiv. Students must wear decent clothes. Good judgment should be used in choosing clothes
- xv. Matters not covered by the existing rules will be at the discretion of the Principal.

- xvi. All notices, circulars and important information will be displayed on the Notice Boards of the College. It is obligatory on part of the students, in their own interest, to acquaint themselves, with the contents of notices and circulars. No concession will be given to them on grounds of ignorance due to their failure to read relevant notices and circulars in time.
