Ever wonder how Earth Day

began? The first Earth Day was held on April 22nd, 1970, San Francisco activist John McConnell and Wisconsin Senator Gaylord Nelson organized a national demonstration to raise awareness about environmental issues. Rallies took place across the country and by the end of the year, the U.S. government had created the Environmental Protection Agency. Dealing with dangerously serious issues concerning toxic drinking water, air pollution, and the effects of pesticides, an impressive 20 million Americans which is 10% of the population, ventured outdoors and protested together. By 1990, Earth Day was an event celebrated by more than 140 countries around the globe. McConnell originally had chosen the spring equinox (March 20th, 1970), but Nelson chose April 22nd, which ended up becoming the

official celebration date (Given that the date of the spring equinox changes over time, it may have made things more complicated to go with the astronomical event rather than just a calendar date).

Today, not only is Earth Day a day meant to increase awareness of environmental problems, but it is also becoming a popular time for many communities to gather together to clean up litter, plant trees, or simply reflect on the beauty of nature. However, taking an active interest in our planet cannot be confined to just a single day. It is an ongoing process. Keeping this in mind, various educational institutions have been conducting awareness campaigns and programmes for children, so that they are sensitized from an early age and take an active interest in making the earth a better place.

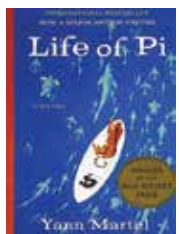

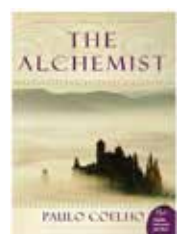

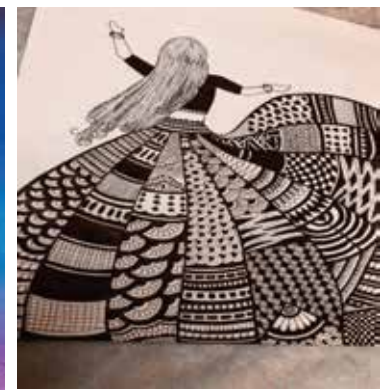
