ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

Tourism is an important sector that has an impact on development of economy of any country. It is a 83 trillion USD industry. The prime benefits of tourism are income generator, employment generator, foreign exchange earner, hence, act as a multiplier effect on economy. For many countries, tourism is the main stay of the economy. The ability of the national economy to benefit from tourism depends on the availability of investment to develop the necessary infrastructure and on its ability to supply the needs of tourists.

Undoubtedly, tourism has lots of economic and social values for a country. It directly connects and impacts many industries and many more indirectly through tourism spend. It is one of the major sources of foreign earnings for a country.

EMERGING TRENDS

Travel giant *Airbnb* made a lot of changes in 2017 to make travellers feel less like tourists and more like locals. As tourists, people are only able to see what is available as common knowledge, and not experience a new location as a local would. They introduced a new experience, which is a way for travellers to be shown around a new city by a local. This enables travellers to have a more authentic experience in a new location, and likely triggers a fond feeling of traveling, which will incentivize them to travel more in the future.

To popularise tourism /places, digitally is another trend setting challenge, in view of *Digital Nomads*' in tourism activities. Likewise there are many challenges to tourism of new age.

Tourism in India has bright future. Number of foreign tourists has increased in many folds from 4.45 million in 2006 to 10 million in 2017.

Tourism sector accounts for about 6.3% of the country's GDP in the year 2015 and it supports 37 million jobs, which makes for about 9% of the total employment. Having many advantages like diverse topography, diverse climate, biodiversity hotspots, varied cultures, rich history and heritage sites in the country, India is one of the most lucrative options for tourists all over the globe.

India was ranked 7th among 184 countries in terms of travel & tourism's total contribution to GDP in 2017. Travel and tourism is the third largest foreign exchange earner for India. Besides this, tourism promotes national integration, cultural activities and the travel point or axis.' Tourism is not same as travel.

The travel and tourism industry is one of the world's largest industries with a global economic contribution (direct, indirect and induced) of over 7.6 trillion U.S. dollars in 2016. The direct economic impact of the industry, including accommodation, transportation, entertainment and attractions, was approximately 2.3 trillion U.S. dollars that year. A number of countries, such as France and the United States, are consistently popular tourism destinations, but other, less well-known countries are quickly emerging in order to reap the economic benefits of the industry.

Worldwide, the tourism industry has experienced steady growth almost every year. International tourist arrivals increased from 528 million in 2005 to 1.19 billion in 2015. Figures were forecasted to exceed 1.8 billion by 2030. Each year, Europe receives the most international tourist arrivals. It also produces the most travellers: with approximately 607 million outbound tourists in 2015, the region had more than double that of the second largest tourist origin, the Asia

Pacificregion.

In 2015, global international tourism revenue reached approximately 1.26 trillion U.S. dollars, having almost doubled since 2005. That year, China had the largest international tourism expenditure, followed by the United States and Germany. The leading city in international visitor spending was Dubai, where tourists spent more than 31.3 billion U.S. dollars in 2016.

India's travel and tourism sector ranks 7th in the world in terms of its total contribution to the country's GDP, according to a new report of the World Travel and Tourism Council (WTTC).

According to data, the travel and tourism sector generated Rs. 14.1 trillion (USD208.9 billion) in 2016, which is world's 7th largest in terms of absolute size; the sum is equivalent to 9.6% of India's GDP.

Additionally, the sector created 40.3 million jobs in 2016, which ranks India 2nd in the world in terms of total employment generated. The sector accounts for 9.3% of the country's total jobs.

India's Travel and Tourism sector was also the fastest growing amongst the G20 countries, growing by 8.5% in 2016. A further of 6.7% growth is forecast for coming years.

WTTC said India's figures are predominantly generated by domestic travel, which accounts for 88% of the sector's contribution to GDP in 2016.

Visitor exports, money spent by foreign travellers in India, only represents 12% of tourism revenues and in 2016 totalled Rs. 1.5 trillion (USD22.8bn). This is

5.4% of the country's total exports, compared to a global average of 6.6%. Data from the UN World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO) shows that India received only 9 million international arrivals in 2016, placing it at 40th place in the world; a tenth of those received by top-ranking France.

However, there is a lot of potential for India to grow their visitor exports. Over the past few months India has already starting to address this gap and made significant changes to visa facilitation, which will help to boost international arrivals. WTTC data suggests that visitor exports had grown by 5.4% in 2017.

David Scowsill, President and CEO, WTTC, said: "India is a tremendous Travel and Tourism economy and I am pleased to see the sector GDP is growing. However, we believe that these numbers could be even higher, and that the positive impact of our sector could be more wide-ranging. India has a huge potential to increase its international visitors and, in doing so, it can create more jobs and drive economic growth.





Report of survey of National Tourism conference, held on 30th March 2019.

An interdisciplinary National Conference on the theme of "Emerging Trends in Travel and Tourism was held on 30th March 2019 in the auditorium of L.S.Raheja college of Arts and Commerce, Santacruz, West. Total 82 people belonging the teaching, non teaching staff alongwith the students attended the conference. There were total 42 participants who presented papers and responded to the written survey conducted for the conference. They were asked to judge the performance of the speakers with 5 parameters and also were asked to give suggestions on the overall conduct of the conference. Following is the result of the survey.

There were total 4 speakers including the Keynote speaker 1) Mr.Aashutosh Rathod, the Joint Managing Director of MTDC, Govt. of Maharashtra; 2) Mr. Pramod Dalvi, Vice President, Kesari Tours; 3)Mr. Ruchit Jangid, Vice President-Ecommerce, SOTC and Professor and 4)HOD of Department of Geography, Dr. S.V. Chavan.

Amongst the abovementioned 4 speakers, two speakers namely Mr. Pramod Dalvi from Kesari Tours and Mr. Ruchit Jangid, from SOTC, were adjudged as the best spekers and communicators as 83% responded positively for them.

While judging the preparedness and knowledge of the speakers, Dr. S.V. Chavan was selected as having the best knowledge of the subject by 78.57 % respondents followed by Mr. Ruchit Jangid (73.8%), Pramod Dalvi (71.43 %), and Mr. Aashutosh Rathod (59.53%).

Only three candidates were judged for the question associated with Responsiveness to the questions asked by participant as Mr. Aashutosh Rathod was a keynote speaker. Amongst the three speakers total 73.80 % respondents chose Mr. Pramod Dalvi as giving Excellent response to questions asked by candidates followed by Mr. Ruchit Jangid (66.66%) and Dr. S.V.Chavan (52.38%).

Dr. S.V Chavan was amongst the top of all speakers while showcasing the usefulness of the topic of the National Tourism conference who was selected by 78.57 % participants followed by Mr. Ruchit Jangid (66.66% responses), Mr. Pramod Dalvi (64.29%), and Mr. Aashutosh Rathod(57.14%).

When asked for the overall evaluation of the conference, then 61.90 % stated for excellent Hospitality, while 28% responses were received for Above

average hospitality and only below 10% stated that the hospitality was average.

When asked for the overall arrangements for the conference then 47.62 % responses were received for excellent arrangement, 33.33% responses were for above average arrangement, while only 16.66 % of respondents stated that the arrangements were average and only 2.38 % respondents were not happy with the arrangements as he considered it to be below average.

So the conference went on well, we will take into consideration the points and will work on it in the next conference.


