The Scam redirects you to this page, where you might be asked to do a few things, while it latches on to your malware by leaving it to your anti-virus but you stolen, it'll be present in the scammer's phishing link logs on his computer. You can immediately contact your bank to let them know you have been compromised so that they can lock your account to prevent any further unauthorized activity from happening.

Rules in Practical Photography!

1. RULE OF THIRD

- * The rule of thirds is a "RULE OF THUMB" for composing visual images such as designs, films, paintings, and photographs.
- * It should be divided into nine equal parts by two equally spaced horizontal lines and equally spaced vertical lines.
- * It states that important compositional elements should be placed along the lines or their intersections.
- * The main reason for observing the rule of thirds is to discourage placement of the subject at the center, or prevent a horizon from appearing to divide the picture in half.

2. RULE OF ODDS

- * The rule of odds states that, whenever possible, a composition should have an odd number of objects, not an even number of objects.
- * So an image should have three flowers rather than two, and five people rather than four.
- * With an odd number of objects, one may become dominant. And viewer's brain work a little harder and look a little longer.



3. GOLDEN SPIRAL RULE

- * In geometry, a golden spiral is a logarithmic spiral whose growth factor is φ , the golden ratio.
- * That is, a golden spiral gets wider (or further from its origin) by a factor of φ for every quarter turn it



4. SYMMETRY

- An image that follows the compositional rule of symmetry is one that looks the same on one side as it does on the other.
- * The image can be split either vertically or horizontally to create a line of symmetry.

5. FILL IN THE FRAME

- * Filling The Frame simply means to fill your photograph with more of the subject.
- * So instead of having negative space or worrying about composition, you are going to get closer (this is where your feet come in, Walk, move closer) and snap it a little closer up.

World Vegan Day is celebrated on 1 November. It is an annual event honored by vegans all around the world every year. The vegan day is observed to encourage people to follow a lifestyle that is vegan and which benefits animal welfare and spreads awareness among people. Veganism has been around for at least 2000 years, and the idea of vegetarianism (not eating meat) may have been around for even 500 years before that! Pythagoras of Samos, a Greek philosopher, and mathematician, made it a life's effort to advocate acting with compassion and care for all animals at that time.

However, it wasn't until 1806, that the concept of veganism as a lifestyle started to take shape. Dr. William Lambe and Percy Bysshe Shelley first pushed the ethical objection to eat dairy and eggs to Europeans at this period. After more than a century, the vegan community finally came together to form the UK Vegan Society. Donald Watson coined the term "vegan" evidently taken from the word "vegetarian." Vegans, at the time, were distinguished by the fact that they did not consume dairy products.

In today's world, vegans are the ones who do not consume dairy products, meat, fish, and poultry and use things that are made up of leather. This definition was then expanded to include eggs, and by 1951, veganism had evolved into a movement of people who refused to participate in any form of animal exploitation. Wearing furs, leather, or other animal items was included under this category. Just a few years later, in 1960, the American Vegan Society was founded.

The President of the UK Vegan Society then chose in 1994 to designate November 1st as World Vegan Day, which is widely acknowledged as the day on which the Vegan Society was founded and on which Vegan Day is

honoured. It's also a great way to kick off World Vegan Month, which is November.

To mark the 50th anniversary of the Vegan Society's formation and the coining of the terms "vegan" and "veganism," Louise Wallis, then-Chair of the Vegan Society in

the United Kingdom, established the event in 1994. "We knew the Society had been created in November 1944 but didn't know the precise date, so I settled on 1 November, partly because it coincided with Samhain/Halloween and the Day of the Dead — traditional periods for feasting and celebration, both suitable and auspicious," Louise Wallis remarked in 2011.

World vegan day was celebrated for all the vegans around the world to celebrate their lifestyle, meet, and share their experiences. It is chosen as an international day of action for animals rights! Vegans celebrate this day as a commitment towards their vegan lifestyle. Around the world, there are many exhibitions and seminars held where the guiders answer the questions of the attendees regarding any problems they may have. These exhibitions or seminars might be helpful for the ones who are thinking to adopt a vegan lifestyle as they obtain additional knowledge about being Vegan.

One reason to observe World Vegan Day is to show compassion for animals. Fewer animal products equal fewer greenhouse gases, which equals a better environment for all. Furthermore, it is healthier for the human body. It's a win-win situation for both parties!


All The Light We Cannot See

WHAT WILL YOU NEED?



- Semolina 2 small bowls
- Curd 1 small bowl
- Chopped vegetables any according to your choice (onion, capsicum, carrot, corn, coriander, bottle gourd, green chilli)
- Salt- as per taste
- Oil 1/2 table spoon
- Cumin seeds 1/2 teapsoon
- Mustard seeds 3/4 teaspoon
- Curry leaves 3 to 4
- Sesame seeds 1 teaspoon
- Spices as per taste (red chilli powder,coriander powder,cumin powder,garam masala)

HOW IS IT MADE?

- Mix 2 small bowls of semolina with 1 small bowl of curd [if needed you can add some water]
- Add chopped vegetables, spices and salt to the batter.
- Add some baking soda in the batter and mix it properly.
- Make a mixture, not very thin or thick and keep it at rest for 10 minutes.
- Keep a deep pan on the burner and add some oil, cumin seeds, mustard seeds, curry leaves and white sesame seeds.
- Pour the batter on the deep pan and close the lid until cooked from the bottom.
- Then flip it and let it cook thouroughly from the other side as well.
- And your dish is ready to serve! Enjoy with ketchup or green chutney.

The Lowest Possible Form of Journalism

Everyone is familiar with the phrase "Yellow yellow dirty fellow". Yellow also symbolizes cowardliness and deceit, attributes that are heavily involved in our topic. The topic is the look down upon practice of Yellow Journalism.

What exactly is Yellow Journalism?

Yellow Journalism is the malpractice wherein newspapers publish news that has little to no background and not an iota of legitimacy. This type of journalism thrives on reckless sensationalism and the controversial potential the incident possesses.

When did the concept of Yellow Journalism originate?

Yellow Journalism was initiated by two individuals - William Randolph Hearst and Joseph Pulitzer. The rivalry between Joseph Pulitzer's New York World and William Randolph Hearst's New York Journal for more readership and circulation led to a bitter battle that lasted from 1895 to 1898.

Why is Yellow Journalism still somewhat popular yet so bad?

Yellow Journalism appealed to the people's thirst for news they perceived as juicy. Mocking up imaginary topics was just one of the tricks to gain readers. According to Frank Luther Mott, these characteristics are why Yellow Journalism initially prospered:

- 1) scary headlines in huge print, often of minor news
- 2) lavish use of images, or imaginary drawings
- 3) use of faked interviews, misleading headlines, and a parade of false

learning from so-called experts.

4) emphasis on full-color Sunday supplements, usually with comic strips 5) dramatic sympathy with the 'underdog' against the system.

In its heyday, Yellow Journalism is a prime reason for the war that took place between the United States and Spain.

How do you recognize Yellow Journalism and try to stop it?

Yellow Journalism flourishes on these traits:

- · News on rape, riots, murder, violence
- · Untrue or partly true reports
- · Lurid exposure of personal lives of persons in power or otherwise
- · Obscenities
- · Distortion of facts
- · Faked stories
- · Misinterpretation of opinions as 'facts'
- · Deliberate invention of tales, calculated to excite the people
- \cdot Recklessness in the construction of headlines or large scare type headlines
- \cdot Blatant emotional appeals
- · Distortions of all kinds to incite antagonistic feelings against the enemy country

To get rid of this practice, consumers of news have to think carefully about where they get their news and information. Seek information, which is the primary objective of journalism and not entertainment. Gradual change will lead to publishers needing to improve the methods with which they spread the news.

And I am glad that I get to smell different flowers. My mother earth holds many roots,


I am glad that I can eat nutritious fruits.
