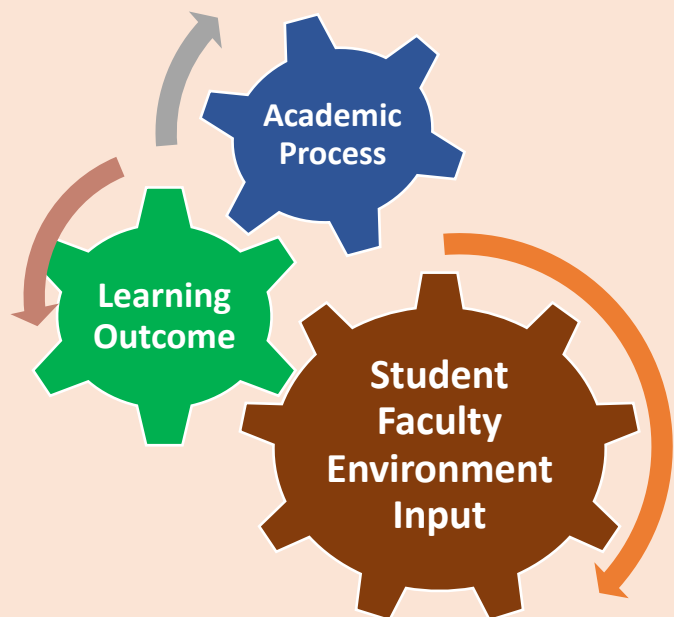

S. Raheja College of Arts and Commerce is a premier educational institute situated in the heart of Mumbai’s suburbs, Santacruz (West). The inscription ‘Deepo Jyoti Prajvalito, Jyanmay, Prakashmay Pradeepah’ on the SES emblem, which means ‘to shun the darkness of ignorance and to spread the light of knowledge’, illustrates the motto of the Society. Established in 1980, it is a Gujarati speaking linguistic minority institution offering quality-oriented education from KG to Ph.D. It has 41 years of excellence in education, research and service. Its illustrious legacy of 4 decades provides students an environment of academic excellence, where they can unleash their potential. Affiliated to the University of Mumbai, the college started its journey by offering Graduate programmes in Arts and Commerce. With its incessant efforts, the College earned a reputation of high standards of calibre and commitment. In 1999, keeping pace with the changing trends in education and the corporate sector, the College was one of the first to offer the then newly introduced unaided programme of the University of Mumbai, viz., Bachelor of Management Studies. It was considered to be the best department in BMS studies amongst Colleges in Mumbai. Thereafter, the college received affiliation BMM in 2005 (renamed as BAMMC in 2019) BAF& BBI in 2006, BSc. IT in 2007 and BFM in 2008. It started M.com. with several specializations from the year 2002. In 2018, the Research Centre (Ph.D.) in Commerce was recognized. From taking baby steps in 1980, the college has now made quantum leaps. It is unstoppable, setting benchmarks of excellence. It was accredited ‘A’ Grade by the NAAC in the first two cycles. Alongside the degree courses, the College offers several add-on / certificate courses Spread over sprawling 2.93 acres, offering a vibrant picturesque landscape, the College is housed in a well planned and well-maintained spacious building amidst a scenic background, with 2 grounds which are used for outdoor games and hosting cultural events. The college building is equipped with ICT enabled classrooms, an Audio-Visual room which is used for screening documentaries and the auditorium with its vibrant modernist architecture is equipped with a state-of-the-art sound system and is used for important events and functions. The college library is a treasure-house of knowledge housing numerous and a varied collection of books, CDROMs, journals, e-books and other e-resources. The library has fully Open Access System, The library also houses a reading room and a UGC sponsored network-resource centre which is used by the students and teachers for study and research. The academic facilities are supplemented by laboratories for computer education, Psychology and Statistics. The college has a spacious gymkhana where students can engage in various sports. The administrative and academic functions of the college are carried out through an ERP and other supporting software.

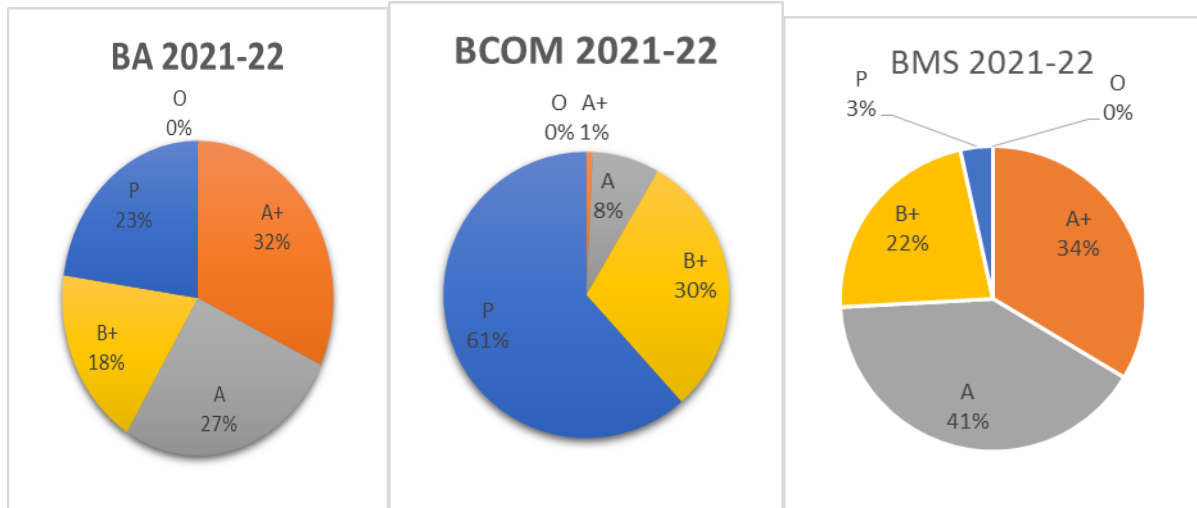

f) Does the curriculum have emerging thrust areas, including interdisciplinary areas? (If yes, elaborate).

The College encapsulates various cross cutting issues relevant to professional ethics, gender, human values, environment and sustainability through curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

Thrust areas in various programs are as follows:

In Business communication, Marketing and Human Resource Management, Business ethics and corporate governance, students are taught ethics in business practices as a part of the curriculum. The institution strives to inculcate professional ethical values in students. The Accountancy syllabus includes a topic on 'Ethics in Accounting', teaching students the ethical aspects to be borne in mind while maintaining accounts and presentation of financial statements.

In TYBA Sociology, students have a paper on 'Sociology of Gender' and 'Gender and Society in India: Contemporary Debates and Emerging Issues'. The Department conducts webinars and competitions to inculcate gender equality.

The Foundation Course exposes students to human values and fundamental rights through projects, presentations and viva. The institution also creates awareness of human values by celebrating Consumer Rights day, World Mental Health Day, World AIDS Day etc.

In Environmental Studies course, the curriculum is associated with the environment and ecosystem, so students develop a sense of responsibility

towards the environment and realization of sustainable development. Clean Diwali, Green Diwali (Eco friendly celebration techniques), Vrukshit (Sapling plantation) help students implement the curriculum in practice.

- In addition to this, Tutorial Books in the courses of Communication Skills of FYBA, Business Communication and Mathematical and Statistical techniques for FY B.COM have been prepared by teachers and the same have been distributed amongst students.
- Workbooks are also prepared for Statistics course for F.Y.B.A. and SY B.A.
- Workbook in the course of Business Economics for Self-Financing Courses has been also introduced from 2018-19.
- Glossaries covering courses (IT, Marketing, Management, Accountancy and Finance, Communication Media) are prepared and maintained for all subjects.
- Course materials for SY B.A. (Economics) and SY B.COM. in Business Economics have been prepared by teachers and distributed to the students.

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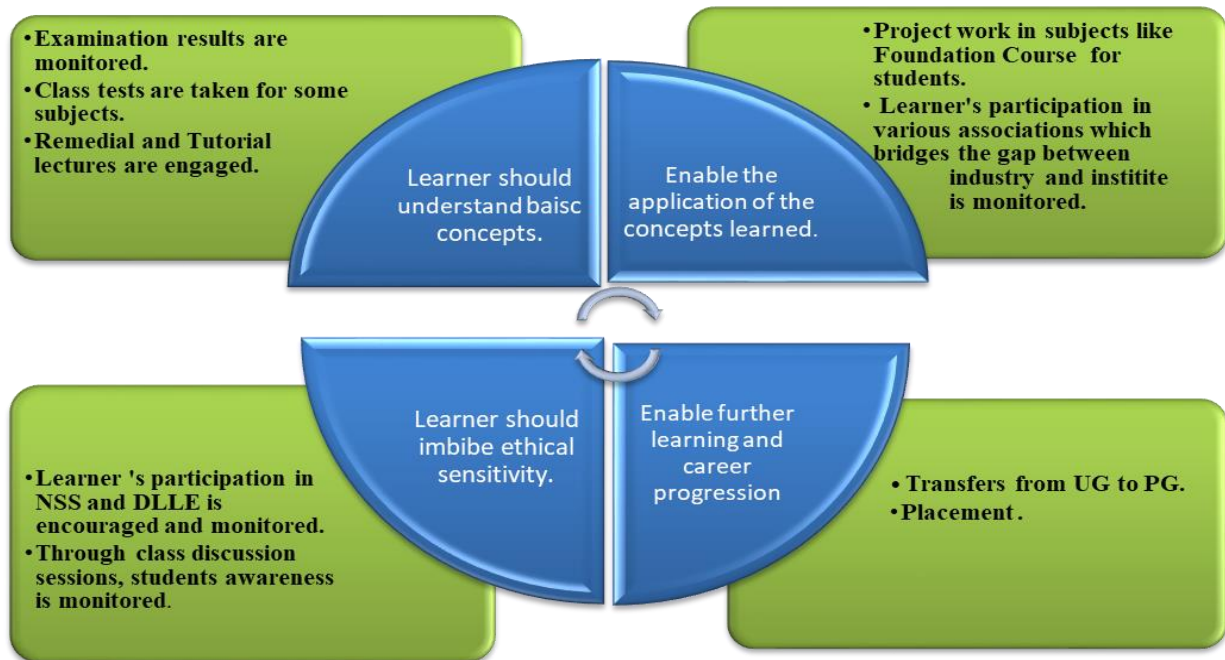
