THE WAIT IS OVER

Preparations are on in full swing in Mumbai which is set to celebrate the Ganapati festival with all its pomp and grandeur after two years of celebrations being marred by restrictions necessitated by the Covid pandemic. It is after two years that devotees of Lalbaugcha Raja will get a chance to touch the feet of Bappa and keep a Navas (vow), said Santosh Kambli, who along with his 81-year-old father Ratnakar Madhusudan Kambli has been sculpting the 14-ft Ganesh idol for decades for the Lalbaugcha Raja. The ten-day Ganesh Chaturthi festival started in Maharashtra

and elsewhere in the country on Wednesday with the coronavirus pandemic no longer casting its shadow on the celebrations.

The idols of Lord Ganesha, the god of prosperity and wisdom and a slayer of obstacles (vighna-harta'), will be installed in homes across the state with pomp and gaiety. First things first, in order to usher the God into your home, you need to clean your house to perfection. After this, fill a Kalash with water, place a coconut on top of it and decorate it with betel leaves. Last but not the least, place the Ganesha idol on a platform which is at some height. Adorn the idol with a sacred thread (Janve) on the left shoulder and adorn it with a sandalwood paste tilak on the forehead and garlands. Devotees can then offer durva grass and red flowers to Ganesha. Mantras from Rigveda can be recited to do pranpratishtha, a ghee lamp should be lighted and the Lord must be offered Modak while daily aartis are performed.

October 19 is marked as World Photography Day. People who are enthusiastic about photography celebrate this day by clicking beautiful captures and showing their love for photography.

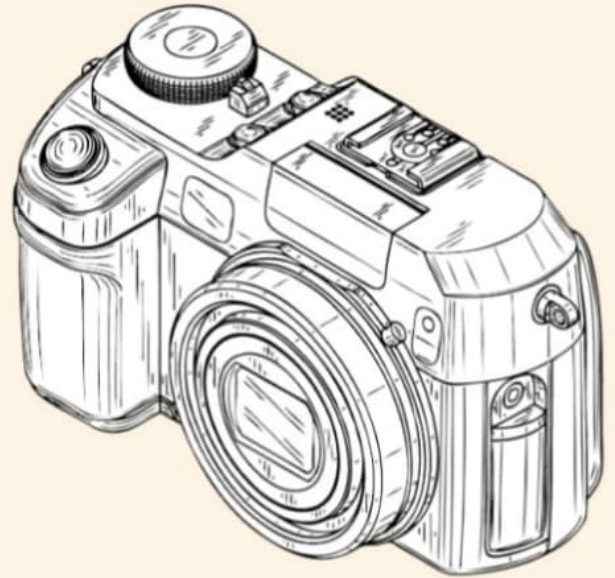

Did you know trees can communicate?

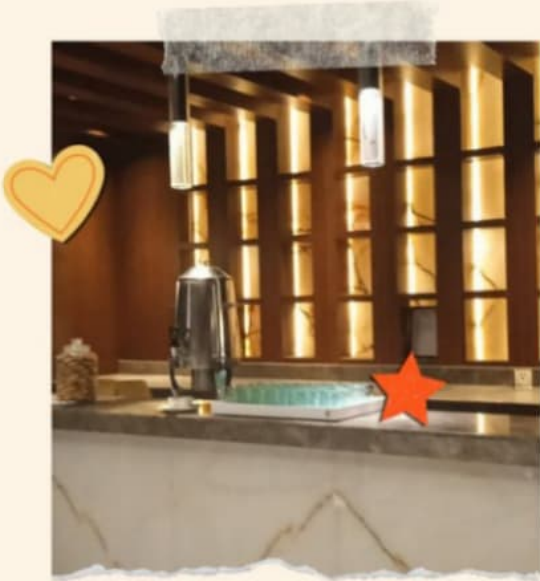
