

Examining and showing the rover's driving capability on the moon. Using the materials found on the lunar surface to conduct and monitor experiments to learn more about the makeup of the Moon. Apropulsion module, lander, and rover make up the three primary parts of Chandrayaan-3.

Hindus commemorate the relationship between brothers and sisters during the holiday of Rakshabandhan. Typically, sisters will wrap their brothers' wrists in a sacred thread known as a "rakhi," signifying their protection and devotion for one another. In exchange, brothers frequently provide gifts or

other expressions of gratitude to their sisters. This holiday is a time for family get-togethers and fostering sibling ties. Traditionally, Rakshabandhan is observed on the day of the full moon (Purnima) in the Hindu month of Shravan, which commonly occurs in August. Sisters apply a tilak and tie their brothers' wrists with a decorative thread known as a rakhi during the ceremony.
